EYFS

Early Years

This month, the Early Years students have been learning about toys. They were excited to share their favourite toys and learn about toys and games from around the world. We also practised playing a few traditional Indonesian games, such as Engrang, Kelereng/Gundu, and Goak Maling Taluh (a traditional Balinese game). It was a wonderful experience for them.

In Bahasa Indonesia, they learned about consonant letters, specifically b, c, and d, and explored words starting with these letters, such as "c" for cicak. They continued to develop their understanding of numbers, building on their knowledge of numbers beyond 10.

In Phonics, they are currently learning Phase 3 and will continue until the end of the term.

Key Stage 1

Year 1/2

During January, Year 1/2 students have been busy with hands-on learning across inquiry and Maths. In inquiry lessons, students explored different materials through a "mystery box" game, guessing materials by touch, as well as an object-hunting activity around the classroom. In Maths, students created jellyfish to practise skip counting by 2s, 5s and 10s, with Year 2 extending this learning to counting in 3s.



Key Stage 2

Year 3/4

This term, Year 3/4 students have been using new classroom tablets to support learning. They are being used for maths games, reading non-fiction books about sound and light, and sharing photos of completed tasks on Seesaw.



Key Stage 3+

Years 5/6 & 7/8

In Grade 5/6 English we have started learning about Poetry and the elements of Poetry. We have also began learning about Gratitude and being thankful.

In Year 7/8 English we are also learning about Poetry and language techniques. In Humanities we are learning about History and are exploring the Qing Dynasty of China. In Mathematics students have been measuring the length of objects and finding the mean, median and mode. In Science the students have been researching the scientists who discovered metalloids.
