In this Month, Our Early Years has had an incredibly busy and exciting month of discovery in our classroom! In Phonics, our Preschool dived into Phase 5 and Reception mastered Phase 7. This momentum carried into Mathematics, where Preschool explored the concept of Number Bonds using hands-on activities, while Reception stepped up to Simple Addition up to 10.

Alongside these core skills, the children turned into tiny adventurers during our theme studies, exploring the fascinating world of Minibeasts and their Habitats to learn all about where these little creatures live. ## Year 1/2

In May, students had so much fun learning about time! They practiced reading and telling time in o'clock, half past, quarter past, and quarter to through different exciting activities. To make learning more enjoyable, we played matching games, clock challenges, and interactive group activities where students worked together to match the correct times with the clocks. The students showed great enthusiasm during the lessons and became more confident in reading clocks and understanding daily routines related to time.

In Inquiry, students explored Indonesian local heroes by working independently in groups. They learned about the heroes' backgrounds, achievements, and contributions to Indonesia. Students enjoyed discovering interesting facts and sharing their ideas with their friends. Through discussions and simple presentations, they developed teamwork, communication, and critical thinking skills.

## Year 3/4

In May, the Year 3/4 class combined our inquiry into how culture shapes art, with our literacy focus of folk tales, and rewrote fairy tales through the lens of a different culture. In maths, we inquired into measuring mass, volume and capacity, and started our unit on representing data. We used tally charts and pictograms to show the class's favourite things.
